
I. INTRODUCTION

A substantial portion of the adjoining low-lying areas have recently been brought under the structured zones of the city due to the accelerated rate of the urban growth in Dhaka. Dhaka Municipal Corporation & Surrounding Thanas, usually known as Dhaka metropolitan area (DMA); have an area of 300.97 square kilometers. this area has a population density of 30,748.8 person/km. The population growth rate of Dhaka city is 4.34% per annum. Average dwelling size or family size is 4.9 persons per household. Dhaka is now growing with an unprecedented growth accommodating 600,000 people per year.



Buyers flat size preference




Apartment price analysis

There is always a gap between the buyers' willingness to pay for flats and the asking price by the developers. Buyers are mostly looking for flats with least price and moderate to high quality. But developers are focused on profit maximization. Hence the willingness to pay to acquire a flat by buyers vary significantly from the asking rate of

the developers, there is also variation in willingness to pay according to different area of Dhaka. On an average for all areas in Dhaka respondents are willing to pay approximately 5900 BDT. While for the next year it will be approximately 6000 BDT, but the standard deviation of this average is high, approximately BDT 4900.



Among them eighteen (18) person thinks that flooring design also has similar impact. Thirty-four (34) person approves that ceiling design and forty-eight (48) person agrees that furniture design technique can

visually increase the interior space. Moreover, about twenty-seven (27) person says lighting design and thirty-eight (38) person believes that interior design arrangements can enhance the appearance of an interior space.

Color can make a space look bigger or smaller, better or worse, irritating or refreshing. Color can create visual balance and harmony.

□ Flooring Design

Flooring or floor covering is a term to generically describe any finish material applied over a floor structure to provide a walking surface. It plays a very important role in an interior space look. As making a room look bigger totally depends on visualizing; size of the flooring material, its design or texture and ways of its arrangement can create huge impact on its viewer or user.

☐ Furniture Design &MultifunctionalFurniture

Simple designed furniture gives a feel of openness on the other hand decorative furniture creates visual barrier and discomfort. In a small room every inch is very important. The more exposed space, bigger and better it looks. A fourlegged bed provides more visible space then a box bed. Huge structured big furniture occupies more space. It is better to use slim and comparatively small size cabinet to provide more free space. Glossy material reflects more lights so it is better to coat the furniture surface with glossy material. One of the biggest challenges in a small space is to provide required functions. A multifunctional furniture can be any furniture with more than one functions. One of the main purposes of furniture into a room is to provide storage space. Which occupies interior floor space. Wall hanging shelf serves greatly as a storage device often without wasting any floor space. Visually such furniture gives a specious feel.

☐ Lighting (Natural & Artificial)

The lighting changes the mood of a room just as it does the perceived size of a room. The elements that come together when the right lighting is achieved transform a room into a whole combination of functionality and style. Darker colors make a room feel smaller and confined. The illusion of space is defined by light reflected off of the surfaces of the walls. Both natural and manmade lighting help with the illusion of space. For a darker room, discover ways to bring in more natural light.

☐ Ceiling Design

The size of the false ceiling is a very important factor for small room. Huge false ceiling (fully covered) can easily reduce the vertical length of a room and can make the room look smaller. It is better not to design any false ceiling for a small room. The ceiling can be decorated by using color illusion or wall papers. Small and simple false ceiling can be designed if it is badly required.

□ Design & Arrangement Techniques

The look of the interior space mostly depends on its designing of the space and its furniture arrangement. One of the common practice and thought is partition walls has to be brick walls. But brick wall blocks a big space of a room which makes the small interior space or room looks even smaller. Instead of that glass partition, board partition or CNC panel can make the space more decorative and spacious too. The more circulation and space provided in a room, the more it will look spacious.
