ACHIEVEMENTS

The third iteration of the "Plan For Every Child (P4EC)-Girls Get Equal" National Conference took place in New Delhi from December 5 to 7, 2018. The three days of in-depth discussions had as their goal the formalisation of specific action items to improve child protection systems in India, particularly for girls and young women, to secure their welfare and the right to a decent existence. The Plan For Every Child National Conference, which was organised by Plan India in collaboration with the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, drew attendees from a wide range of professions, including lawyers, public servants, journalists, representatives of civil society organisations, experts, and practitioners in the field of child rights both domestically and abroad.Mr. Rakesh Srivastava, Secretary, Ministry of Women and Child Development, as well as Ms. Upma Srivastava, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, were present for the opening session. The keynote lecture on prevention, justice, and responsibility for children was given during the conference by Hon'ble Mr. Justice Madan B. Lokur of the Supreme Court of India.

The country's systemic approach to bolstering child safety was improved during the 2018 P4EC National Conference. More than 80 distinguished speakers from various backgrounds discussed the need of improving child safety systems in every nation's administration. The three-day conference allowed for numerous sessions, presentations, and discussions on various aspects of child protection, including the need for research and evidence building; role of media, communities, grassroots institutions, executive, and legislature in putting the last girl first; integrative approaches to child protection; and more. The key partners focused on systems to create strong safety nets for girls and young women with a vision to enable

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children, especially girls, to learn, lead, decide, and thrive.

unique session on children's The experiences and views of safety at home, school, and community, titled "Make our World Safe -Who is Accountable?" was one of the conference's standout moments. Participatory consultation with kids aged 5 to 10 in four states with Plan India programme regions was used to collect the voices. The goal of the session was to record children's voices in support of their growth and safety, especially those of girls, whose concerns and voices are sometimes ignored due to a presumption of incapacity. The Plan for Every Child National Conference served as a venue for discussion and idea exchange on topics pertaining to kids in challenging situations in 2016 and 2017.
